- Two of Mark’s Patriot Ancestors were involved in the Tavern Trade. One on the maternal side in Lenox, MA. And one on the paternal side in Simsbury, CT.
- This presentation engages the audience with facts and stories of taverns, keepers, patrons, and the build-up to the Revolution.
